THE GREATEST STORY OF ALL

We all love good stories, they 'live' in books, movies, plays, songs, poems, opera, dance and in many other formats. The Bible is packed with stories; collectively they tell the greatest story ever told, The Gospel! This is sometimes referred to as the Biblical Meta Narrative, loosely translated as 'Bible Big Story'.

The plot for this 'Big Story' is framed around four main themes: Creation, Fall, Redemption and the Restoration. Here's a very concise summary of the Biblical Meta Narrative: God created a beautiful world and gave Adam and Eve the responsibility to look after it. Adam and Eve were deceived by the Devil and disobeyed God; as a consequence of their disobedience, sin entered the world and was passed down from generation to generation. God, motivated by his great love, intervened; which is summed up in the following verse:

'For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life.' John 3:16.

Jesus overcame the power of sin and death through his crucifixion and subsequent resurrection, he then ascended to Heaven and heralded the releasing of the Holy Spirit, to live within those who acknowledge Jesus as Lord.

Where are we up to in the Big Story? The eternal Kingdom of God has been established for over two thousand years and we are now living in the days of restoration. Empowered by God's Spirit, Christians are called to work in harmony with Him and each other to build the Kingdom of God.

We dearly want our young people to live in harmony with God's plan and find their place in his Kingdom, the place of abundant life that Jesus has for all who look to, and follow him. One way in which we seek to achieve this is through the curriculum we teach. Our curriculum is intentionally designed through a Christian Worldview lens, via the 'Creation, Fall, Redemption, Restoration' meta-narrative framework. God has given us a wonderful resource...time. But life is filled with more distractions than ever.

To slow down and put distractions aside so that we can notice or see, and to be inquisitive about what we see is one way to build relationship. By being available and present we show we are invested and interested in what is important in our children's lives as well as what's happened in their day.

We begin to notice changes in mood, physical energy, motivation and attitude. We provide opportunity to celebrate achievements and to safely allow them to process and resolve challenges, both large and small. Even a young person, whose growing desire is for privacy and independence, wants to be noticed and understood and to know that someone is available.

Put down the phone, turn off the TV, put work away, prioritise commitment, and start a conversation about the little things you notice with your child or teen. This is one of the best investments that can be made.

HEALTHY LIVING SKILLS

Healthy Living Skills (HLS) is a subject area in the Health and Physical Education curriculum. This curriculum teaches personal, social and community health. Being healthy, safe and active is of vital importance in our fast paced society, and therefore it is also crucial students learn how to communicate and interact for health and well being.
